On this day and date below written, personally appeared the affiant whose signature is hereto affixed and who being duly sworn according to law testified as follows:

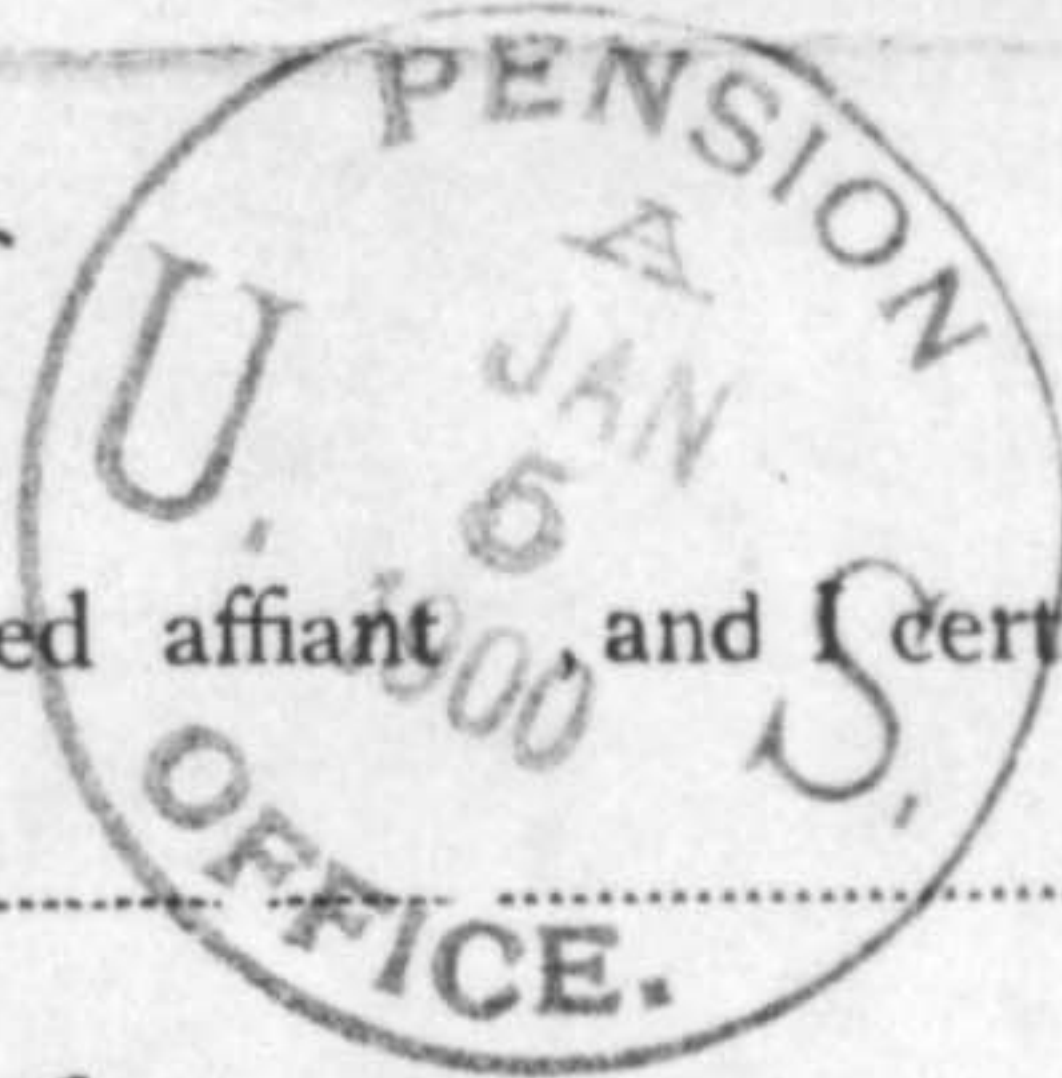
"My name is John A. Smith alias James A. Reynolds. I am 59 years old, and I reside in Baltimore, Md. at No. 2233 Division Street.

My correct name is John A. Smith but I served in the army under the name of James A. Reynolds. I was a slave and ran away from my master and lived with a family named Reynolds and I enlisted under that name. My father's name was Smith to best of my knowledge and I have gone by that name for years and was married by that name of John A. Smith. I did not tell my attorney my correct name of Smith because I thought all my papers had to be under that name I served in the army. I cannot furnish medical evidence to show extent of my disabilities since Jan'y 13/99 for reason I have had no regular medical attendance but have treated myself as best I could always using liniments & such things
