 40 about war times.

A. 42 Why she is dead; that is what my said brother told me.
 43 It was while he was living in Baltimore, Md., that I
 44 learned from my said brother that the wife, Mary, was dead.
 45 I used to visit him while he lived in Baltimore. Now, wait
 46 I only visited him once while he lived in Baltimore.
 47 Well now, I cannot state when it was that I first
 48 heard of the death of that wife Mary; I know it was
 49 several years after the close of the war [Civil] but whether
 50 five or ten years after, I cannot state; don't remember.
 51 I can state this though, that it was before my said brother
 52 married this claimant. No sir, I cannot state how long
 53 before he married the said claimant it was that he told
 54 me that the wife, Mary, was dead. No sir, I don't know
 55 how many children he had by the wife, Mary. You see,
 56 I didn't know anything of their married life together, as
 57 I was up north here nearly the whole time and they
 58 were down there in Maryland, Baltimore and about.
 59 The only child of that marriage living today that I
 60 know of is John E. Adams, married after his father's
