 65 but I don't know the name of the man he works for.
 66 Those are all I can think of who knew me before I
 67 was married. Yes, all those named are colored people.
 68 As near as I can
 69 come at it, I was about twenty three or twenty four
 70 years old when I was married to my said husband.
 71 Yes Sir, my
 72 said husband & I lived together from the time of our
 73 marriage up to his death, we were never divorced
 74 or separated from each other. Now let me see: He
 75 ^(was) married in the Spring, about Strawberry picking time
 76 and we lived near Snow Hill from our marriage to
 77 the following fall. Now wait! Right away after our
 78 marriage, we moved down to near Pocomoke City, Somerset
 79 Co; Md. and stayed there until the following fall,
 80 then we moved back to near Snow Hill, Worcester Co;
 81 Md., and we stayed there that time some five or
 82 six years; then we moved over to Baltimore, Md. We
 83 lived at Baltimore up to about six years ago, when
 84 we came up here to Philadelphia and this city has
 85 been our home ever since; my husband's home to
 86 the time he died, & my home all the time to the present.
 87 I had seven
 88 children by my said husband, namely, in their order:
 89 Festus, George, Lena, John, ~~Arthur~~, Carrie & Willie.
 90 They are all dead but Carrie and Willie. Carrie is
 91 about 24 years old & Willie is about 26 or 27
 92 years old.
 93 My said husband, John E. Adams, was born
 94 and raised down near Pocomoke City, Somerset Co; Md.
 95 That I know him about a year just before my marriage
 96 to him. He has some half-brothers and sisters
 97 living; two half-sisters and three half-brothers, namely
 98 Alex, Sidney & Moses Mills; "Leeskia" Cottman,
 99 wife of — Cottman, don't know first name, and
 100 Lavinia; she is married, but I ^{don't} know her married name,
 101 but her maiden name was Mills. They all live
 102 near Pocomoke City, Somerset Co; Md; at or near a
