

DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

State of Maryland, County of Baltimore ss:

On the 28th day of December, A. D. one thousand nine hundred and eight personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace, within and for the county and state aforesaid Elizabeth Dayricks, aged 67 years, a resident of Baltimore City, County of Maryland, State of Maryland, who, being duly sworn according to law, makes the following declaration in order to obtain pension under the provisions of the Act of Congress Approved, April 19, 1908.

That she is the widow of Richard Dayricks, who was enrolled (Enrolled or commissioned), under the name of Richard Dayricks, at on the 22nd day of March, 1864, as a private in Co. D. 39th Regiment U.S.C. Inf. Here state rank, and company and regiment, in the Army, or vessels, if in the Navy. and honorably discharged as 1st Sgt. December 4th, 1865, having served ninety days or more during the late civil war.

That he also served _____ (Here give a complete statement of all other services if any.)

That he was not in the military or naval service of the United States otherwise than as stated above.

That she was married under the name of Elizabeth Coby, to said soldier at Near Woodensburg Md on the _____ day of _____, 18____, by Rev Henkle; that there was no legal barrier to the marriage; that she had not been previously married; that the soldier had _____ been previously married. first Marriage of Soldier dissolved by Death (If there was a prior marriage of either, the date and place of death or divorce of former consort or consorts should be stated.)

and that neither she nor said soldier married otherwise than is stated above.

That the said soldier died December 25, 1908, at Baltimore City Md. that she was not divorced from him, and that she has not remarried since his death.

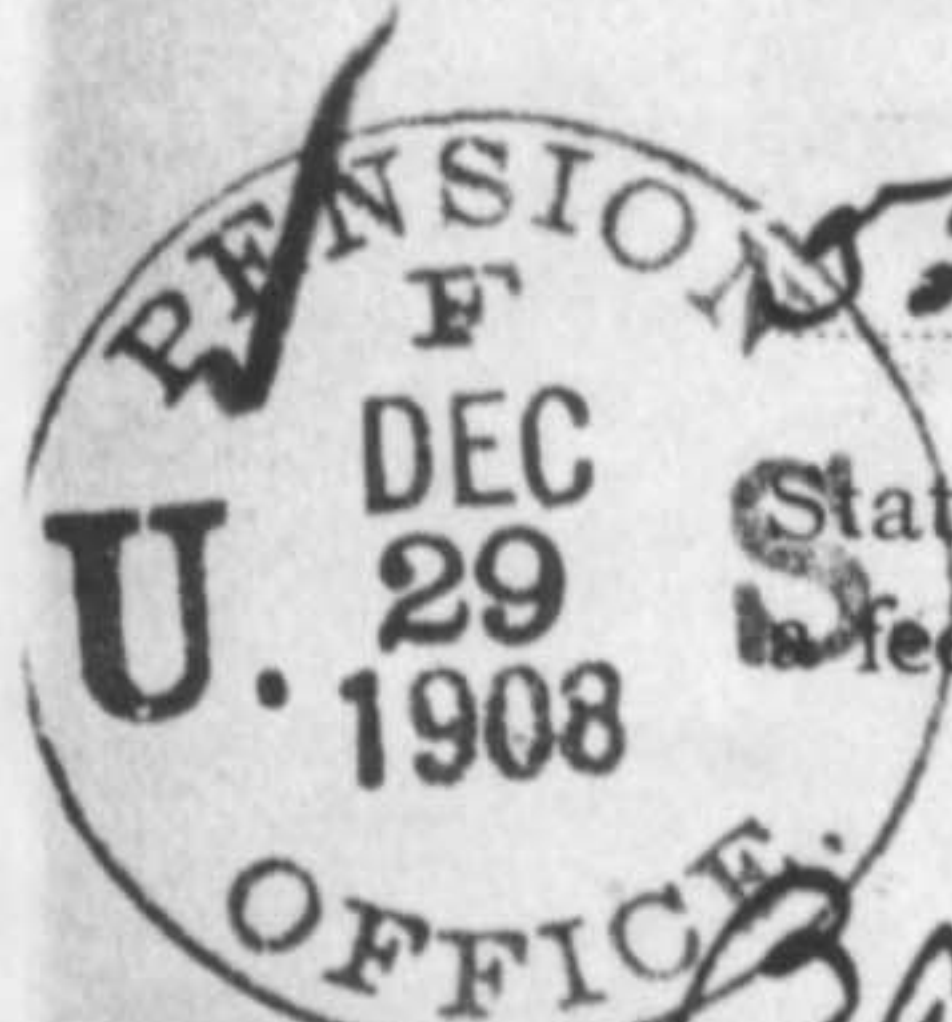
