 the death of Charles Bennett, March 11th, 1923, as I was also present at
 the funeral, and I am positive that she has not remarried since his
 death.

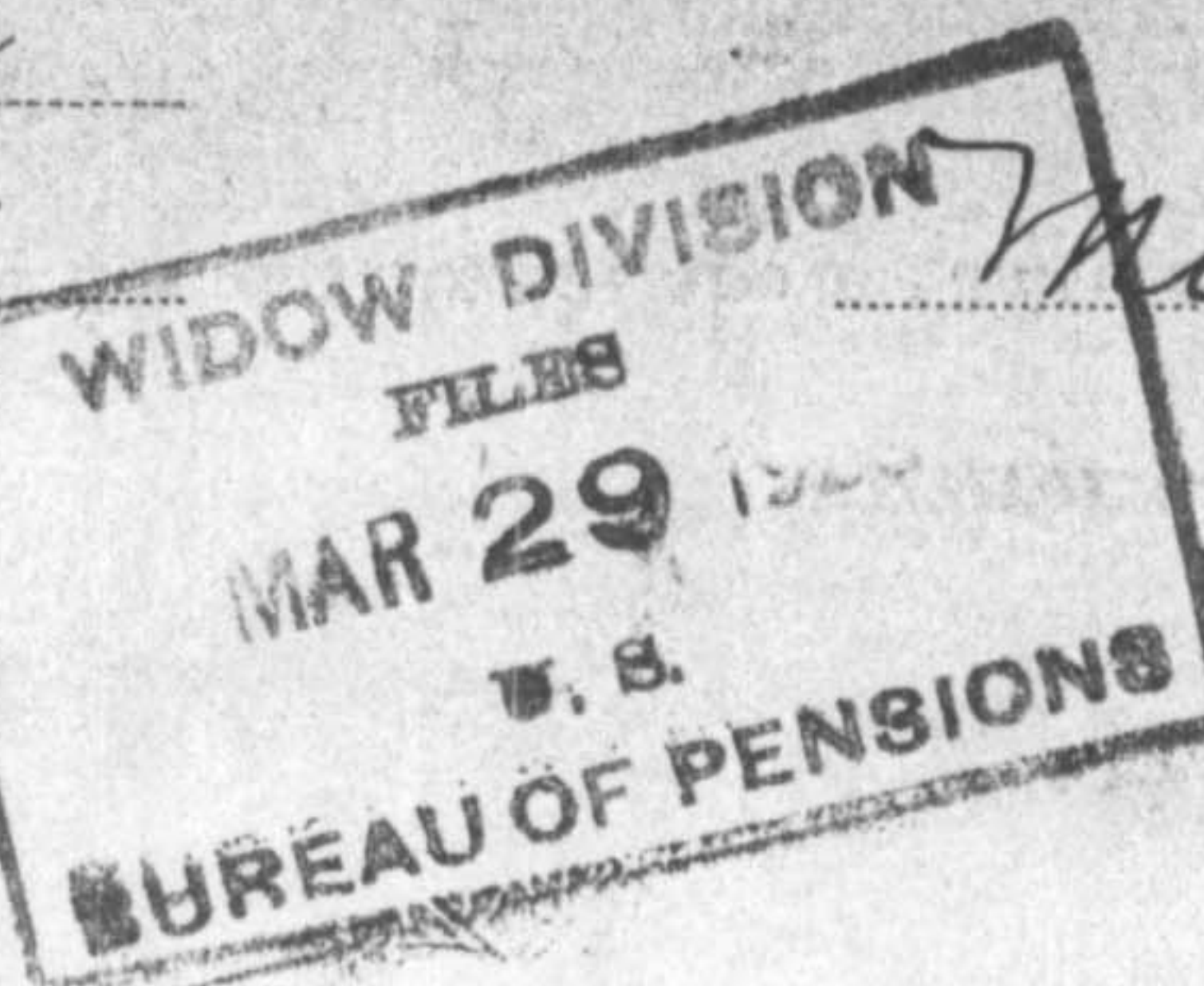
My knowledge of the above matter is from the fact that I am
