dead.

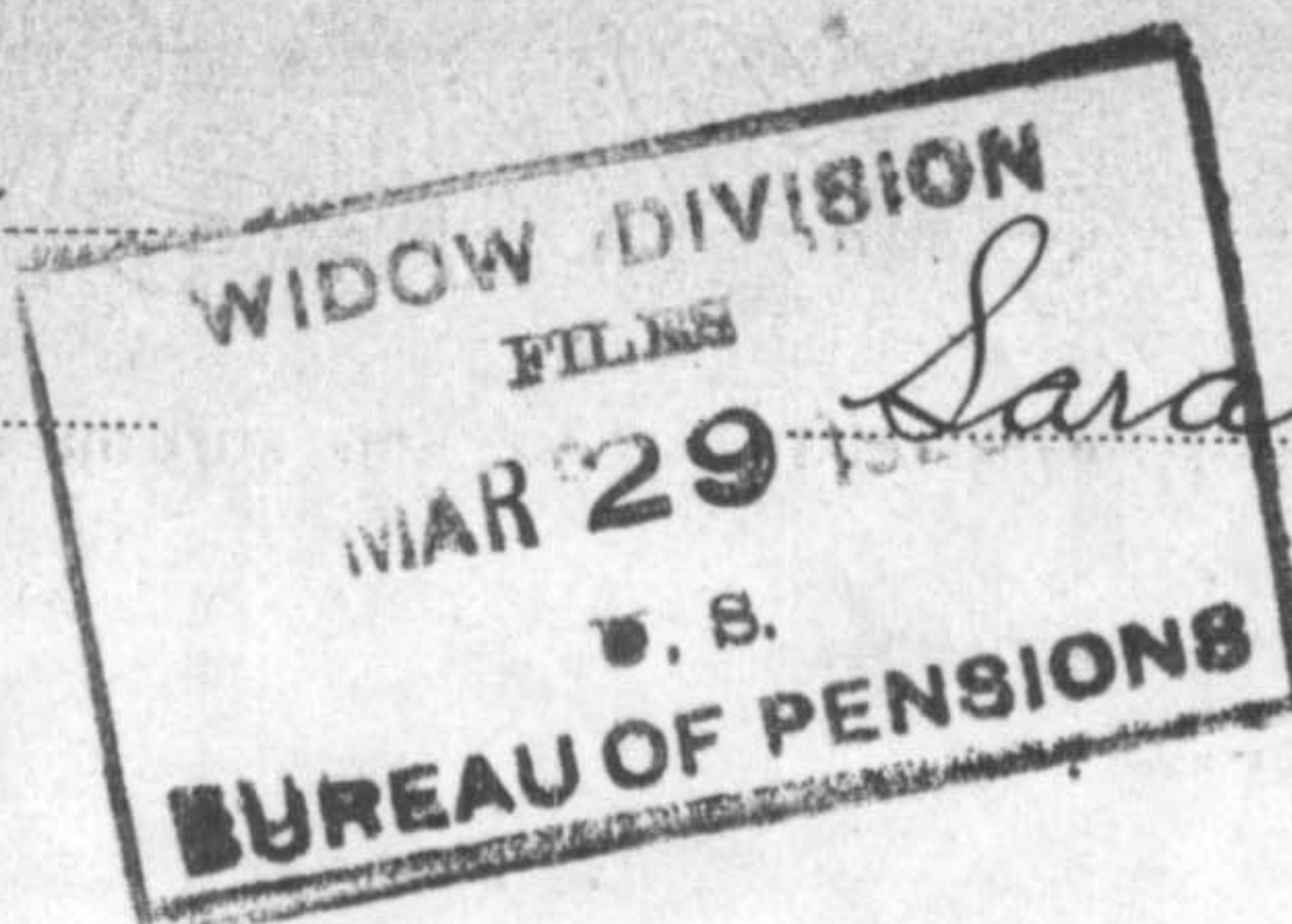
My knowledge of the above matter is from the fact that I
