They had a son that was a pretty good size when I first saw him awhile after my return. He used to bring him to the shop. This son William enlisted in the army about the time that Garfield was shot.

I have never heard Alice say anything about whether she lived with Adam before the war or not. I do not know the ages of her children. She has not married since Adam's death. She has no more property than I have, and I haven't any.

I went with Alice and my wife to Vernon's office when she made her application. We identified her and were witnesses to about what I have told you. We were all sworn. I am correctly reported.
