DEPOSITION L.

Case of Alice Barker, No. 556,156

On this 1st day of January, 1894, at Baltimore, County of Baltimore, State of Maryland, before me, C. A. Henneley, a Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Mary Fantrooy, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to her during this Special Examination of aforesaid pension claim, deposes and says: I am 20 years old. Will be 21 next July 4. Occupation, laundress. Residence and postoffice address, 828 Bradley Street Baltimore, Md. I am a niece of Alice Barker and have known her ever since I was small. I was at her house on the day each of her children was born, Moses, Jacob and Elijah, but not present at their births. I can not give the dates. I did not give the dates at Col. Vernon's office. I only told them that I was at the house the same days the children were born. I gave my age as 20, not as 24. The young lady wrote the paper. Moses, Jacob and Elijah are all the children of Adam Barker. She lived with Alice Barker as her husband all the time I knew them till his death. I don't know anything about their marriage. She has not married or lived with any other man since his death. She has no property. She makes her living washing and ironing.
