

Declaration for Increase of Pension

Under the Acts of June 27, 1890, and May 9, 1900.

State of Baltimore, County of Baltimore, ss:

ON THIS 9 day of February, A. D., one thousand nine hundred and seven

personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace within and for the County and State aforesaid Richard Dutton, a resident of Baltimore City County of Baltimore State of Maryland

who, being duly sworn according to law, declares he is a pensioner of the United States, enrolled at the Washington D.C. Pension Agency at the rate of 12⁰⁰ dollars per month,

Certificate No. 666200; by reason of disability from Right incomplete
(Here name the disability for which pension was granted.)
berina, rheumatism and senile debility

That he was a Corporal in Co. B. 4 Reg't U.S. Colored Vols.
(Here state rank, company, and regiment, if in the army; vessel, if in the navy.)

Infantry.

That he is 83 years of age, having been born on the _____ day of

January, 1824, and believes himself to be entitled to an increase of pension on the ground that the rate allowed him is too low and not commensurate with the extent of his present disability.

He therefore requests that he be favored with another medical examination with the view of determining his right to \$12 per month, the full rate allowed under the Act of June 27, 1890, as amended by Act of May 9, 1900.

That said disabilities are not due to his vicious habits and are to the best of his knowledge and belief permanent.

He hereby appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation, himself
Richard Dutton, of Baltimore, Md.

his true and lawful attorney to prosecute his claim.
