Pensioner, James Armistead, Certificate No. 664927

Pensioned from May 17, 1890, at \$ 2 per month for rheumatism,  
 Act of July 14, 1862. Pensioned from May 14, 1891, at  
 \$ 6 per month for rheumatism and disease of rectum,  
 Act of June 27, 1890. Pensioned from March 2, 1895, at  
 \$ 6 per month for rheumatism, Act of July 14, 1862,

Original declaration, Act of July 14, 1862, filed May 17, 1890,  
 alleged rheumatism, chills and fever and malarial poisoning,  
 Admitted as to rheumatism - as above - rejected as to malarial  
poisoning - no disability since filing - Entitled to Act of March  
2, 1895. Declaration - Act of June 27, 1890, filed May 14,  
1891, alleged piles - disease of eyes, dyspepsia, disease of heart,  
kidneys and back. Admitted for rheumatism and disease  
of rectum - as above. Disease of eyes, dyspepsia, disease of  
heart, kidneys and back rejected Sept 26, 1891 - Not  
 permanently disabled therefrom.

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
