Before that I had lived on China St. and
before that I had been living at the
Newton Academy on W. Baltimore St. for about
two years.

Charles Sugars, James Sorsy, now dead, knew
me before I enlisted.

I was never sick before I enlisted except
one time when I was a boy about twelve
years old I was sick a few days
on account of working in the heat.

No, sir I never had any other sickness
at all before I went in the army.

When I enlisted I was examined out at
Camp Belgia. I was stripped and exam-
ined by a doctor - he was said to be a doctor
A lot of us were examined at the same time
One after the other were examined. I dont know
the doctors name.

Me and my brother-in-law George Johnson
(he died) went out and enlisted together.
When I was at Smithville, N.C. I think, it
was near Ft. Caswell. in the fall, I believe and
I had been in the army about a year when I
contracted rheumatism, chills and fever, they
call it malaria. The rheumatism affected me
in my legs so I could hardly walk at all.

I was treated in camp by our doctor and I think
his name was Tucker. He treated my rheumatism.

I was treated in hospital at Newburn N.C. about
four weeks or a little longer toward the latter
part of my army service. about the fall of 1865.

I was treated for chills & fever then.

I was in a little hospital once before I was at
Newburn. Then I had malarial trouble. Cant tell
where that little hospital was. Think it was some
where near Ft. Monroe but I cant remember for
sure where it was. I cant really say.

I never was treated at City Point.
