A Yes sir.

I knew Chute had been sick at Smithville, N.C. and I know nothing more of his disability only he had diarrhoea -

He was perfectly helpless about Sept. '65 I saw him in hospital at Newbern N.C. and I saw very little more of him until he came out of the Army.

I lived in the house with him for a short time after he came out of the Army - On Raboy St.
