laborer, & reside at 803 W. Franklin St, this city. I served in 739 USC Inf - Enlisted 1863 & discharged 1865. I draw \$6 per month pension. I have known Clint. since I first met him in the service. He was in the 39 USC Inf but I forget what company he was in. I never knew him before he enlisted, first met him in the service when we were at Sugar Loaf in North Carolina in the Spring of 1865 he was complaining but I couldn't rightly tell what his complaints were.

- Q What did he complain with?
- a I cant tell you. I know he was off duty sick but that is all I know.
- Q Do you know if he had rheumatism?
- a I dont know.
- Q Chills fever or malaria?
- a Dont know sir. He might have had some of those things but I dont know what his complaint was. I used to see him more or less every day in service yrs, sir I think we were at Smithville N.C. I cant rightly remember now whether he was complaining at Smithville N.C. I know he has been ailing ever since he has been at home pretty much.
