*Have seen him so sick he couldn't do a days work. That was about 7 or 8 years ago. Yes, he has been complaining since about a year or two after he came out of the army.*

*I don't know how long he worked in the brick yard. I guess some 15 yrs. when he worked he worked regularly - No he didn't work all the time*
