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- Q Pals? Dispepsia?
- A Not as I know of.
- Q Heart trouble or kidney troubles?
- A never heard him complain of it.
- Q Did he have rheumatism before he went to N.C.? - yes sir.
- Q How do you know he had chills at Jingerston?
- A I was in the tent with him.
- Q He has been complaining of feeling bad & could hardly get along on account of his legs & his head hurt him was dizzy, even since the war when I would meet him.
- A I have seen him time after time since discharge.
- Q He hasn't worked much that but I don't really know how much work he has done.
- Q Where was your company when he first complained of rheumatism?
- A I can't tell you - We enlisted at Camp Belgia, went there to Annapolis & then we marched down into Va somewhere and he complained on that very march and always after that of rheumatism & his head.
- Q Rupture? - I never heard of it.
- Q Justification understood & answers correctly recorded
