DEPOSITION QCase of James Armstrong, No. 664927

On this 9 day of May, 1895, at
Baltimore City, County of ...
 State of Md., before me, Thos. R. Handwick, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Matthew
Griffin, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: I am about 57 yrs. old

Occupation - Sight labor.P. O. address 443 W. Biddle St. This city.

I served in 239 U. S. Inf from Feb. 31 '64
 to Sept. 4 '65. Capt. was in same company
 with me. Met him first in the service
 at times he was complaining in the army.
 He had misery in his stomach & used to
 throw up. I can't say where nor when it was.

He was sometimes excused from duty. I can
 say when nor where it was only in Va.
Capt. say if he ever had anything else
 the matter with him in the army -

I was at Smithville. He can't say when
 but I can't say if he was sick or well
 while at that place -

Can't say if he had any complaint at
St. Caswell - Don't remember if he
 went to hospital at Newbern N.C. or any-
 where.

Can't say if he had chills & fever in the
 army - Can't say if he ever had
 any rheumatism in the army -
 We didn't tent together.

We came home together. Can't say he
 was complaining then and for a
 good while after that. I lost sight
 of him.
