Sir:-

You are informed that the medical evidence on file in your case does not show that you are suffering from a mental or physical disability which incapacitates you from the performance of manual labor in such a degree as to render you unable to earn a support so as to entitle you to a rating under the act of June 27, 1890.

It also appears that your claim under the general law is ready for allowance and you are now entitled thereunder to \$6 per month for rheumatism.

You are informed that your pension under the act of June 27, 1890, will be dropped and your claim under the general law will be allowed unless within thirty days from receipt hereof, (the period fixed by the act of December 21, 1893) you shall file evidence, medical if possible, showing that you are entitled to a higher rate under the act of June 27, 1890, than is above indicated.
