Sir:

Under date of June 1, 1895, you were notified by this Bureau that, unless it should be shown that such action would be improper, your pension under the act of June 27, 1890 would be terminated and that your claim under the general law would be allowed at the rate of \$6 per month for rheumatism.

You are informed that so much of said notice as related to your general law claim was erroneous, and in fact upon a review of the testimony on file it is found that the same is not ready for allowance.

Your pension under the act of June 27, 1890 will therefore be terminated and your claim under the general law will be further considered, and you will be allowed thirty days from receipt hereof in which to make such answer as you may deem proper and to show cause why the action above indicated should not be taken.
