Claim No. 639478 of *Wid of John Kineyea* Co. *B* 7 Regiment, *U. S. C. I.*

On this day and date below written, personally appeared the affiant whose signature is hereto affixed and who being duly sworn according to law testified as follows:

"My name is *Adeline Kineyea*, I am ^{about} *40* years old, and I reside in Baltimore, Md., at No. 313 N. *Pine* Street.

I am the claimant in this case. I do not know my exact age. I find I made a mistake in giving date of my marriage as 11th June 1874 I should have said 11th June 1872. The Marriage record I herewith filed is correct except the spelling of my husband's name: John Charles Kineyea should be John Charles Kineyea. The name is rather peculiar and is frequently misspelled. I do not know how to spell it myself but I know that letters to me have had it spelled in a variety of ways & I suppose Father Gore misspelled it in returning my marriage or else the party who took out the license spelled it wrong. I do not own any property whatsoever of any kind or character but am absolutely wholly dependent upon my own daily labor for support. No one is legally bound to support me. I was never divorced from the soldier.

This was all written in my presence & only from my own oral statements to A. P. Lloyd at his office this 26 August 1896 without aid or prompting by any writing, printing or reciting. Except reference to record of my marriage.

I have no interest in this claim."

INSTRUCTIONS—Read Carefully.—Under the order of the Commissioner of Pensions number 229 in the preparation of testimony in support of claim in pension cases, all statements affecting the particular case and not merely formal, must be written or prepared to be type-written in the presence of the witness, and from his oral declarations then made to the person who then reduces the testimony to writing or then prepares the same to be type-written. And such testimony must embody a statement by the witness that such testimony was written or prepared for type-writing (as the case may be) in his presence, and only from his oral statements then made; stating also the time, place, and date, when, where and to whom he made such oral statements, and that in making the same he did not use, and was not aided or prompted by any written printed statement or recital, prepared or dictated by any other person; and not attached as an exhibit to his testimony.
