On this *9th* day of *March*, 18*91*, at
Baltimore City, County of _____

Young, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to her during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: *My age is 42; occupation, laundress;*
P.O. address, No. 1316 Eastern Branch, Baltimore
City, Md. I was the widow of *Robert*
Young, late 1st Lt. Co. B. 4th U.S.C. I think
March when he exhibited no more discharge
 I was married to him Sept. 2, 1886,
 by Rev. Robert F. Wayman, an officer
 Methodist minister of Tristram St. A. M.
 Church; we were married at my home
 No. 90 Morris Alley, King's son, William
 Robinson, Mergenthauser, Robert
 Young (minister of North St. African
 Baptist Church) were present at the
 marriage; I knew my husband for
 eight years before our marriage and
 so far as I know he had never
 been married before; he told me
 he was single; I was the slave of Johnson
 Patton, of Tappahannock, Essex Co.,
 Va. up to the time of emancipation
 and had lived with a colored man
 named *Arthur Robinson* for about
 a year before emancipation and
 after emancipation he deserted
 me; we were now legally married;
 I had two children by him; both
 one now living; I had no children
 by *Arthur* and *his* were married
