Furthing, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer

truly all interrogatories propounded to her during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: My age is 32; occupation

domestic; P.O. address, No. 506 Preston
Baltimore City, Md. I knew Robert
 the soldier for eight years before he
 died and claimant for the past
 years; I was her bedchamber maid when
 she and Robert Young were married
 by Rev. Mr. Wayman; I can't remember
 the date; I always understood from her
 that he had never been married
 but heard he had lived with a woman
 in Philadelphia and another in the
 city, but knew their names; he told
 me that he lived with these women
 but he denied ever being married to
 anyone he claimed; I never knew
 claimant to be married before and
 know she has not married since
 soldier's death; soldier always re-
 claimant as his wife and they were
 so regarded by the neighbors; she
 had many children by claimant; she
 has two children, Walter and Martha
 the former about 23 and the latter about
 25; I always understood they were his
 children by a man named Robert
 with whom she lived during slave
 times, but that she was not married
