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and was sent to McKim's Mansion House Hospital and there remained until discharge, Dr said he had functional diseases of stomach, also had gravel three or four months before discharge, Had a kind of aching cramp or misery in stomach when discharged that has continued at intervals ever since, Has had no medical treatment since discharge except for abscess in stomach about eight or nine years ago, Dr Gardner then treated him and lanced the abscess, About two months after discharge went to work for Arthur Mann, in a livery stable, Continued in his employ about six months, then went to driving private carriage for Thomas Llanahan, and so continued for six years, Mann paid him ten dollars per week, Llanahan forty dollars per month, good wages for the employment, Has not been able to do heavy work since discharge but has generally been able to do light work, has owned and driven a horse and cart engaged in removing dirt and cleaning cellars, since he quit driving Carriage for Llanahan, Has laid up all winter before last with pain in back, Dr Gardner said it was lumbago, Has been laid^{up} with his stomach a few times since discharge, but not more than a week at a time has not lost much time on account of his stomach,

The general reputation of Claimant is good, though it will be seen he was not strictly truthful in his statement
