Claimant, says he has no other witness to introduce except James Fredericks and David G. Decoursey, Went to work for Arthur W. Mann, within two months of discharge from U.S. Army, worked for him about 14 months, suffered with weakness, and pains in back and side during that time, lost a day or two now and then, amounting in all to about two weeks in the 14 months, Don't account for Mann refusing to sign his deposition, was always on good terms with him, never had a disagreement, Was able to perform all the duties assigned to him while working for Thomas Llanahan, but often felt unwell suffered with pains in back, and nervous sick headache, Llanahan often heard him complain of that, and several times told him to take a five grain blue mass pill, Worked for Llanahan about seven years, Did not care to go see him because he kept a months wages from him without cause, a fellow servant charged him with using the family carriage without leave, and taking a large basket away on front of the box, Llanahan
