DEPOSITION *Fe*Case of *James Henson*, No. 328330

On this *7* day of *September*, 1883, at
Baltimore, County of *Baltimore*
 State of *Maryland*, before me, *James H. Clement*, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared *Arthur H. Mann*
 who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of afore-
 said pension claim, deposes and says: his age is 55 years, resides at 231
Madison Avenue Baltimore Md. Kept Livery Stable
on Howard Street in said City in the years 1865
1866 & 1867. The Claimant James Henson worked
for him for a year or more during that period, but
deponent has no record or memoranda showing
the date of such employment.

Q What was the physical condition of Claimant
 while he worked for you as stated.

 he worked well and was regarded by me as a good
 stable hand, I can't say I noticed his health.

Q Do you know anything about him since he left
 your employ, or since he worked in your stable,
