DEPOSITION *H*Case of *James Henson*

On this 11 day of September, 1883, at
Baltimore, County of Baltimore

State of Maryland, before me, James H. Clements, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Charles Gola,
 who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of afore-
 said pension claim, deposes and says: his age is about 40 years, resides at 87

N. Charles Street, Baltimore Md. Has known the Claimant for
 many years, principal knowledge of him was while he was a Coach
 man for Robert Barrill, Agent for the sale of Peruvian Guano at Bal-
 timore, said Barrill was a Bachelor, but kept up a fine establishment—
 Claimant drove his Coach six or seven years, Deponent was an intimate
 visitor at the home and office of said Barrill, and thus became well
 acquainted with Claimant,

Q Was Claimant a sound healthy man at that time, or until
 Mr Barrill left Baltimore

A He was to all appearances, was active and gave general satisfac-
 tion, I never knew him to be sick—

Q When did Robert Barrill leave Baltimore,

A I don't remember the date, but I remember that it was during
 the progress of the late war,

Q Do you know anything of the Physical Condition of Claimant
 since he left Mr Barrill,

A I have no positive knowledge, I have seen him at times on the
 street, and heard him complain of some affection of the liver,
 but I don't know to what extent he has been disabled

Q Are you directly or indirectly interested in the claim of
 James Henson for a pension,

A I am not,

Q What is your business or profession

A I am a Teacher of Music,
