Respectfully referred to
Mr. H. R. McCalmont
Chief S. E. Division,
with a view to a special
examination to determine
whether the claimant was
a sound and healthy man,
and especially free from
any disease of stomach, at
and prior to enlistment;
whether the alleged disease
of stomach was contracted
in the service and line
of duty; and whether there
has been any disability

for the further reason
of his inability to furnish
medical testimony of
treatment for said dis-
ease from date of discharge
to the present time, and
the fact that the witnesses
who testify to the disability
since discharge are
residents of Baltimore and
therefore cannot be verified
by Postmaster.

The special exam-
ines should obtain the
evidence of neighbors, fellow-
workmen, employers &c, as
to his ^{claims} physical condition
at and prior to enlist-
ment; whether at that

possible, (if medical cannot
be obtained, then that of
neighbors, fellow-work-
men, employers &c. who
know the facts and are
reliable persons) that
said disease, ^{has} been con-
tinuous and every
year from discharge
July 25 to the present time,
and the extent of the
disability arising therefrom
during each year of said time.

All obtainable record
evidence together with the testi-
mony in said claims, including
the Post Office address of witnesses
has been fully briefed.
