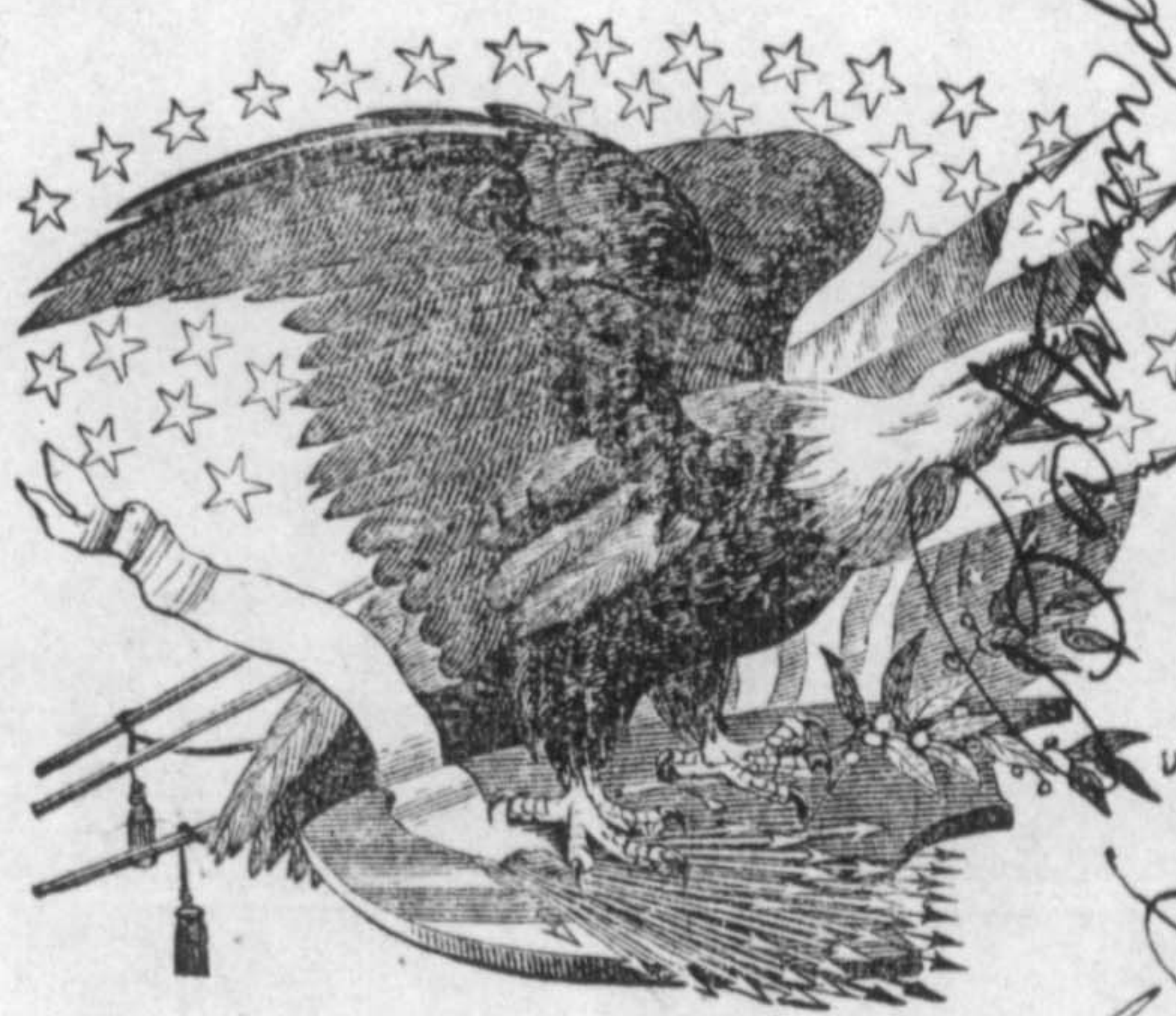

Company, ("K"), 19th Regiment of United States Colored
VOLUNTEERS, who was enrolled on the Twenty first day of March
one thousand eight hundred and Sixty four to serve three (3) years or
during the war, is hereby **Discharged** from the service of the United States
 this Twenty fifth day of July, 1865, at Baltimore
Maryland by reason of functional disease of stomach on the evidences of
Confirmed Nervous Disease.
 (No objection to his being re-enlisted is known to exist.)*

Said James Wenson was born in Queen Anne's
 in the State of Maryland, is twenty one years of age,
five feet six inches high, fair complexion, brown eyes,
black hair, and by occupation, when enrolled, a Coachman

Given at McKims Camp Baltimore this Twenty fifth day of
July 1865.

*This sentence will be erased should there be anything
 in the conduct or physical condition of the soldier
 rendering him unfit for the Army.
