DEPOSITION *6*Case of *Annie Hales* — , No. *1002404*

On this *20th* day of *Sept*, 1913, at *Baltimore*, county of *Baltimore City*, State of *Md*, before me, *W. H. Howell*, a Special Examiner of the Bureau of Pensions, personally appeared *James Dorrin*, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this special examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says:

1 I am 69 years old, Occupation
 2 Laborer, Post Office 1110 Jen-
 3 King Alley, Baltimore Md.
 4 I served in Co D 19th US
 5 Col Inf under the name of
 6 James J. Davis and am pensioned
 7 at \$46.00 per quarter.
 8 I knew William Hales in Kent
 9 County Md near Chestertown before
 10 I enlisted. He was a bound boy
 11 and I was free and we went to
 12 church on Sundays. He lived
 13 on the same place one year.
 14 In the service our regiments
 15 were not together and I never saw
 16 Hales so far as I now remember.
 17 After discharge I resided in
 18 Kent County while Hales came
 19 to Baltimore and I saw very little
 20 of him until in 1904 when I
 21 moved to Baltimore myself. He used
 22 to come back to Kent and visit
 23 me occasionally. Will Hales
 24 had no wife before he enlisted
 25 nor after discharge until he
 26 was married to his present widow
 27 Annie. I didn't try to keep up
 28 with him after he came to Balti-
