 was then promoted to a Captaincy of Co "A"

Question, Do you remember a Soldier of Co A of
 said Regiment—a recruit—named James Colb,

Answer, I don't remember the man, but the records
 show him absent in Hospital, name ^{of Hospital} not mentioned, when
 the Regiment was mustered out, he never rec'd his discharge,
 I don't know what became of him,

Question, Do you remember where the Regiment
 was in August 1864,

Answer, We were in front of Petersburg, about Bermuda
 Hundred,

Question, Have you any remembrance of being on a
 foraging or other expedition for supplies or otherwise during
 the Summer of 1864 when one of your Regiment died on the
 march, from exhaustion or Congestion of the
 chest,

Answer, I don't remember, I had a large Train, was on
 many expeditions, men may have died on them without my
 knowledge, I did not command the escort,

Question, Do you know where any of the other Officers
 of Co A 30 Col Troops could be found,

Answer, I do not,

 commissioned officer of said Co
