

of his regiment, was under a Captain Davis, Did not receive a discharge, was sent home very soon after M^r Lincoln's death, Was not a slave, Was married before the war to Lizzy Dorsey, she died during the war, Afterwards on the 27 day of October 1874 was married to Grace Annie Malek, with whom he still lives as husband and wife, Never knew James Cole of Co "A" 30 Col Troops, is not acquainted with Claimant, Is not personally acquainted with the P.M. at Collioth Mills, but has met him, he sent for deponent last March and "told me he had put in a claim for my pay for the time I was at Camp Belger" Was never paid while in service, Was not acquainted in the vicinity of Cokeysville, during or preceding the late war, Witness is a respectable coloured man, I conversed with his wife before seeing him, and saw their marriage certificate they have no connection whatever with Claimant,

Deposition C, pages 39+40 Richard Touque, swears before me that he was a soldier in Co "A" 30 U.S. Col Troops, was drafted at West River and joined the Regiment June 14, 1864, was discharged at Goldsborough N.C., in June 1865, There were two members of said Co "A" named Cole, one was named James and the other Ezekiel, James was taken sick while on a march in hot weather near Belle Plain
