

Page 12 found my brother dead and helped to bury him, Norris made affidavit in behalf of claimant, but I have heard that he died on the 8 or 9 day of last June, Claimant has not re-married or lived with any man as his wife since the soldier's death, Knows James Anderson, who used to be called Jim Johnson, and who was in Co "A" 30 Col Troops, went to see him last night, was not admitted on account of severe illness of said Anderson, Witness is a Truckman, bears a very good character, lives in a respectable manner and neighbourhood, James Anderson, referred to in his statement, died Oct 19, 1882,

Kirkwood, P.M. at Ellicott's Mills stating that "there is a James Cole and wife (Ann Cole) now living at No 5 Little Vine Street, Baltimore Md. said James Cole was drafted into the U.S. Service during the late war from this vicinity, letter is dated Dec 22<sup>nd</sup> 1881.

Deposition D, pages 37 & 38 James A Cole, swears before me that his age is about 40 years, resides at No 5 Little Vine Street Baltimore Md, where he has lived for the past three years, was raised at Ellicott's Mills, was drafted in Baltimore during the late war, and put in Camp Belger never went to the front, Don't remember the name
