the boat that rescued him & helped to pull
him in with a man named Joseph
Pierce. We carried him to the ship & he
was there treated by Surgeon Rust. From that
time on up until his discharge he suffered
from my personal knowledge from Rheumatism
& was at times so crippled up with it that he
couldn't go on duty. Since his discharge
he has to my personal knowledge continued
to suffer from Rheumatism which I am
positive was contracted as aforesaid
