DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

 ON THIS 3rd day of November, A. D. one thousand nine hundred and nine
 personally appeared before me, a Notary Public
 within and for the county and state aforesaid Adeline Barnes
 aged 54 years, whose Post Office address is 941 N. Eutaw St
Baltimore, Maryland who, being duly sworn according to
 law, declares that she is the widow of John S. Barnes who enlisted
 under the name of John S. Barnes, at Baltimore Md
 on the 2^d day of January, A. D., 1864, in Sergt. Co. F. 19th Regt
U.S.C. Troops (Here state rank, company, and regiment, if in
 Army—vessel, if in Navy.)

and served at least ninety days in the late War of the Rebellion, in the service of the United States, and
 was honorably discharged 15th January 1867 and died October 27th 1909
 Date of discharge. (Date of death.)

That she was married under the name of Adeline Waters to said
John S. Barnes on the 8 day of June, 1876
 by Rev Jas. W. Handy, at Baltimore, Md

there being no legal barrier to said marriage. That said soldier or sailor had not been previously mar-
 ried. That applicant had not been previously married.

That she has not remarried since the death of said soldier or sailor. (Name of Soldier or Sailor.)

~~That she is without other means of support than her daily labor, and an actual net income not exceeding
 \$250 per year; that names and dates of birth of all the children now living under sixteen years of age of
 the soldier are as follows:~~
