I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. 193,584, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office that John D. Barnes was enrolled on the 2^d day of Jan'y, 1864, at Kent Md in Co. F, 19th Regiment of U. S. C. T. Volunteers, to serve three years or during the war, and mustered into service as a Corporal on the 8th day of Jan'y, 1864, at Camp Stanton near Bryantown Md, in Co. F, 19th Regiment of U. S. C. T. Volunteers, to serve three years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. F, of that Regiment, for the months of Jan'y to Feb'y 29, 1864, he is reported Absent, with remark, Detached on recruiting service Feb'y 2^d. From Feb'y 29 to June 30th Present for duty, From June 30th to Dec 31st Absent, "Wounded since Aug't 10" 1864". On all subsequent M. Rolls of Co. "Present for duty". He was mustered out with Co. Jan'y 15' 1864 at Brownsville Texas, (a Sergeant)
