DEPOSITION 7Case of Adeline Barnes, No. 930.023

 7 old. I have heard that she
 8 married Barnes but I never
 9 met him. I think claimant's
 10 maiden name was Whisman for
 11 her mother's name was Whisman.
 12 My daughter tells me that
 13 claimant's maiden name was
 14 Waters - that her mother was
 15 married twice, but I did not
 16 know that her mother was
 17 married twice.

18 Claimant was a young single
 19 girl when I first knew her
 20 After I had known her a number
 21 of years, I heard that she married
 22 some one named Barnes, I never
 23 have heard that claimant was
 24 married but the one time.
 25 I knew claimant well when
 26 she was a young girl she and
