

Declaration for Widow's Pension

Act of June 27, 1890.

To be executed before some officer authorized to administer oaths for general purposes. The official character and signature of any such officer not required by law to use a seal must be certified by the clerk of the proper court, giving dates of beginning and close of official term. If certificate on file, so state.

State of Maryland, City of Baltimore, ss:

ON THIS 18 day of February, A. D. one thousand ~~eight~~ ^{nine} hundred and ~~ninety~~ ^{one}

personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace within and for the City and State aforesaid, Elizabeth C. Rosier

aged 55 years a resident of the City of Baltimore County of Baltimore State of Maryland

who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of

Elby Rosier who enlisted under the name of Elby Rosier

at Baltimore Md on the January day of

A. D. 1864 in Co N. 9th U.S.C.T.

Here state rank, company and regiment, if in the army; vessel, if in the navy

and served at least ninety days in the late War of the Rebellion, who was HONORABLY DISCHARGED

Dec 1866 and died January 31. 1901
The cause of death need not be stated

That she was married under the name of Elizabeth C. Hardy to said

Elby Rosier on the 25 day of January

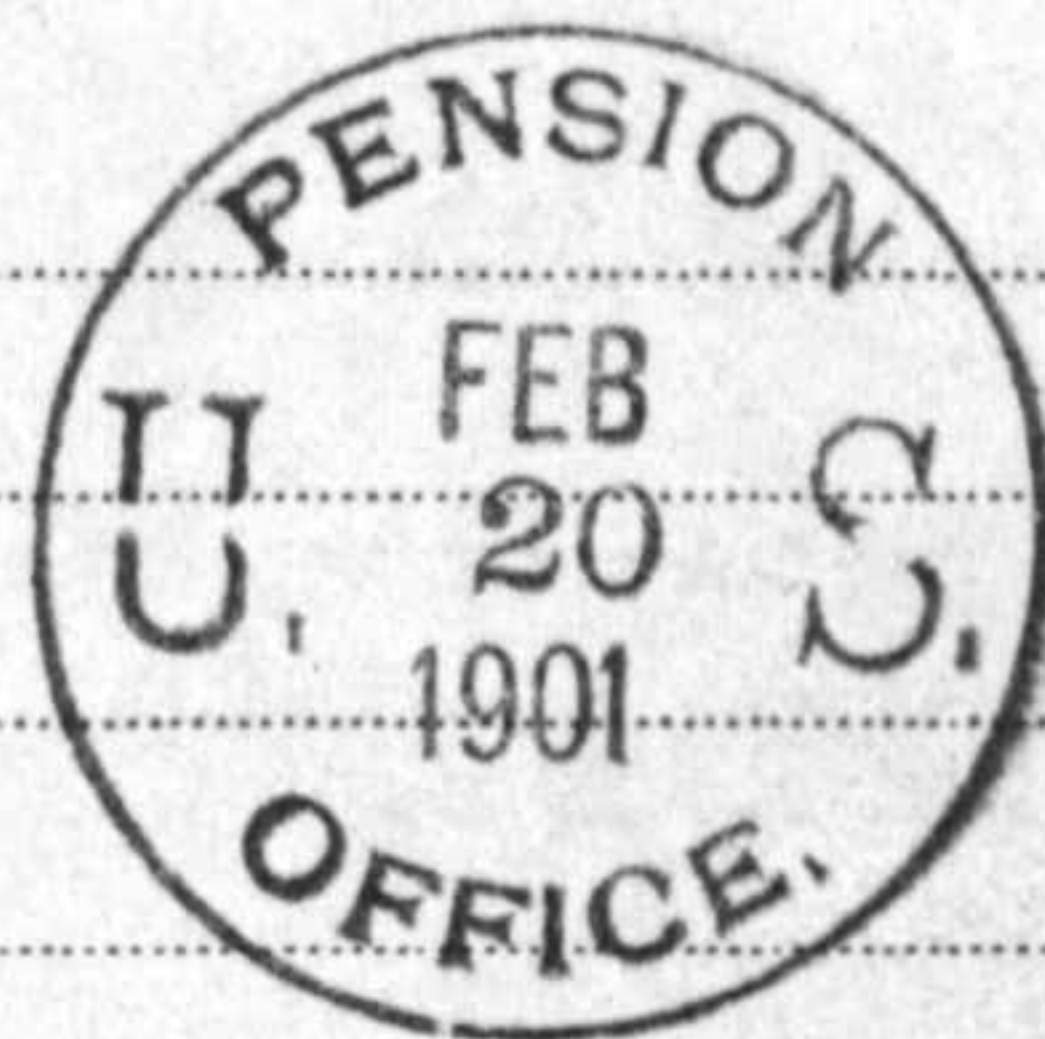
1870, by Rev James Peck at Baltimore Md

there being no legal barrier to such marriage. no prior marriage of either
If there was a former marriage of claimant or her husband, state it here and how dissolved

That she has not remarried since the death of the said Elby Rosier
Name of soldier or sailor

That she is without other means of support than her daily labor. That names and dates of birth of all the children now living under sixteen years of age of the soldier are as follows:

Claims benefit of Act of May 9th, 1900 amending Act June 27th, 1890, her net income not exceeding \$250, not 18

That she has heretofore applied for pension and the number of her former application is but Soldier drew

Be careful to fill this part of the blank correctly

That she makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States under the provisions of the Act of June 27, 1890. As amended by Act of May 9th, 1900. She hereby appoints

her true and lawful attorney to prosecute her claim, and she directs that the sum of Ten Dollars be paid him for his services.
