

Claim No. 735594 Of ^{Widow of} Elby Rosier Co. 14 9 Reg't. *U.S. 7*

On this day and date below written, personally appeared the affiant whose signature is hereto affixed and who being duly sworn according to law testified as follows:

"My name is *Elizabeth C. Rosier*. I am *53* years old, and I reside in Baltimore, Md. at No *1309* *Division* Street.

I am the claimant in this case. I was never married before I married the soldier Elby Rosier and he was not previously married. We were never divorced but lived together up to the moment of his death. I have not since remarried and have owned no property excepting the house in which I live. I rent out rooms in it to the amount of \$8 a month. I am otherwise wholly dependent on my own daily labor for support. No one has been legally bound to support me since my husband died. The property in which I live might possibly rent for \$25 a month, i.e. \$300 a year but not over 2/3 of this I would have to pay \$77 ⁵³/₁₀₀ a year ground rent (for I do not own the ground although I have to pay tax (about) on assessed value of both house and ground) about \$40 a year wear and tear & at least \$25 a year should be allowed for loss of rent. \$3 for insurance & \$7 for water bringing my net income down to less than \$120 a year. My husband's correct name was Elbert Rosier but he never used any name other than Elby although in death record name is given as Elbert. I have no interest in this claim.

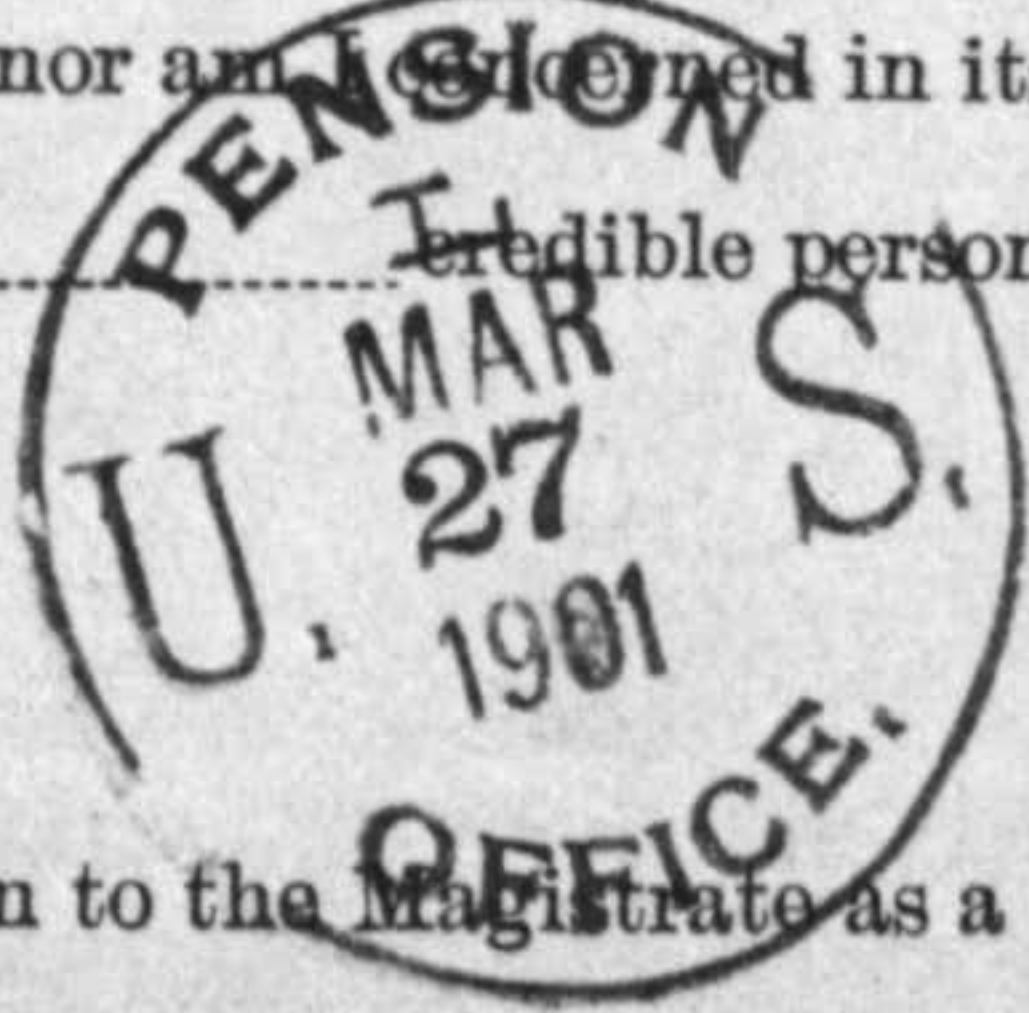
