DECLARATION FOR INVALID PENSION.

Act of June 27, 1890.

Note.—This can be executed before any officer authorized to administer oaths for general purposes. If such officer uses a seal, certificate of clerk of court is not necessary. If no seal is used, then such certificate must be attached.

STATE OF MARYLAND, CITY OF BALTIMORE, ss:

On this 7 day of June, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and ninety seven, personally appeared before me, a JUSTICE OF THE PEACE, within and for the City and State aforesaid Elby Rosier, aged 56 years, a resident of the City

of BALTIMORE, State of MARYLAND, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical

Elby Rosier, who was ENROLLED on the 64 day of Co H 9th USCT, 1864, in Co H 9th USCT

United States in the war of the rebellion, and served at least ninety days, and was HONORABLY DISCHARGED at

Baltimore, on the day of , 1866

That he is wholly unable to earn a support by manual labor by reason of Rheumatism

injuries from which disabled.)

lungs injury left ankle and nursing in breast

& general debility I have been disabled ever since

before I was dropped from the rolls.

That said disabilities are not due to his vicious habits, and are to the best of his knowledge and belief of a

permanent character. That he has applied for pension under application No. . That he

was a pensioner under Certificate No. 654582 but was dropped from the rolls.
(If a pensioner, the Certificate number only need be given.)

If not, give the number of the former application, if one was made.)

That he has never been employed in the military or naval service otherwise than as stated

above again

That he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension-roll of the United States, under

the provisions of the act of June 27, 1890. He hereby appoints

his true and lawful attorney to prosecute his claim, and he directs that the sum of TEN DOLLARS be paid to
