I am 43 years old, address porter, post office address 548 West Lanvale st, Baltimore Md.

I am a son of the late pensioner John Morsell and will report that he died at my address at 12.30 A M on Wednesday November 25, 1925 and he was buried in Mount Auburn Cemetery. My father left no widow surviving, and no children under the age of sixteen years.

John Morsell was married but one time and that was to my mother Eliza Ann who died in Baltimore thirty years ago. Fathers service was with the 7 U S C and Co H. He was pensioned at \$72 under ctf No 1019179.

I nursed and cared for my father John Morsell for fully fifteen months before he died and I gave up my work in Cleveland Ohio to come to Baltimore to do so. John Morsell left about \$1000 on deposit in bank and it was more than sufficient to defray the expense of his last illness and burial. He owned the house we lived in and left a Will disposing of his property.
