I hereby certify, That I have carefully examined Benjamin Nicholson late a Private Co "C" 30th Regt U.S.C Troops

in the service of the United States, who was discharged at Alexandria on the 25th day of January 1864, and is an applicant for an invalid pension, by reason of alleged disability resulting from (Wounds) Injury.

Degree of disability.

In my opinion the said Benjamin Nicholson is Two Thirds incapacitated for obtaining his subsistence by manual labor from the cause above stated.
