DECLARATION AND IDENTIFICATION IN DUE FORM.

PROOF EXHIBITED.

Discharged for incised wound of left ankle  
joint received while cutting wood near the Weldon R.R.  
Oct. 20, 64.

Two of his comrades certify they were detailed  
from their regiment to do duty at the Weldon R.R.  
and while there a fire broke out in the woods which  
threatened the tents & Commissary Dept. & that it had to  
be removed & while replacing them about Oct 13 64  
the axe flew off the handle in driving a post for  
the tent to rest on.

Sept. 7, 66, Sr. Phillips rated him 2/3 for incised  
wound of the inner ankle joint of left foot.

Admitted Sept 25, 1866, to a Pension of \$ 5 1/3 per month, commencing

Jan'y 22, 1865.
