Occupation laboring. I was in the service with the soldiers of this claim. I enlisted in Co B. 39 U S C T in 1864, and was discharged in 1865, while not in the same company with this soldier I knew him by lying in hospital same time with him. My acquaintance continued with him after service until he died.

I can say I don't know any thing about his married life. I don't know if he was married while in the army or not.

I can't recollect making an affidavit in this case. its signed by mark which indicates that I signed it. it must be my affidavit but at this time I have no remembrance of making it. it makes the statement regarding his disabilities as I personally know did exist. but of his private life I don't know any thing whatever. Sam Bond who lives in East Balt. was orderly sergt of Co E. T if he could be found perhaps could give some data to work on.
