After I was sworn I took the paper back to Mr. Lloyd. The young man with the eye glasses or did not go to the Squires with us, he was not in the Squires Office when I was there.

I signed my paper in the Squires Office so did my identifying witnesses.

I don't remember but one paper on that day. I know I signed one.

I have been to Mr. Lloyd's twice only on my own case. The second time I went & took Caroline Polk & Ella Dixon to prove that I was the wife of the soldier & that neither me nor my husband had ever been married before & that I had not married again since my husband died, & that my children were living.
