I have nothing by me by which I can prove the date of this birth - I know I waited on her and know that this child for whom she claims pension is the identical child I delivered her of. I was not with this Chat when either of her other children were born. This is the only child I know about and I believe that the date she gives of the time of this birth is correct.
