

DECLARATION FOR ORIGINAL INVALID PENSION.

UNDER AN ACT GRANTING PENSIONS TO SOLDIERS AND SAILORS WHO ARE INCAPACITATED FOR THE PERFORMANCE OF MANUAL LABOR AND PROVIDING FOR PENSIONS TO WIDOWS, MINOR CHILDREN, AND DEPENDENT PARENTS.

On this 25 day of August, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and ninety —, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace, a

John S Wesley, aged 60 years, a resident

of Baltimore City, County of —, State of Maryland, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is

the identical John S Wesley, who entered service during the War of the

Rebellion under the name of John S Wesley on or about the middle day of

March, 1864, as private in company E of the 39th regiment of

U.S.C. commanded by Capt. Edw and was

HONORABLY DISCHARGED at Fort Edward Kell Baltimore on or about the

20 day of Dec, 1866, by reason of Man closed

; that his personal description is as follows: Age, 60 years;

height, 5 feet 6 inches; complexion, copper; hair, black; eyes, black. That he is now suffering from Rheumatism

(Here state the name and nature of any disease, wound or injury which in any manner disqualifies you for performing full manual labor, no matter when the same originated or developed.)

and that the said disability is of a permanent character, and is not the result of vicious habits, and that it incapacitates him from the performance of manual labor in such a degree as to render him unable to earn a support, and that this declaration is made for the purpose of being placed upon the pension roll, under the provisions of the Act of June 27, 1890. That he has never been employed in the military or naval service otherwise than as stated above.

That since the latter part of the year, A. D. 1865, he has not been employed in the military or naval service of the United States.
