Disease of heart - The action of heart although slow is regular and of normal size and I find no organic lesion at this examination.

The respiratory organs are in fairly good condition - His expansion is 4 inches and the normal respiratory murmur is distinctly heard throughout the left side when he is asked to take a full inspiration, there is however a tendency to some pulmonary stasis on the right which at present is more marked on account of the hemiplegia.

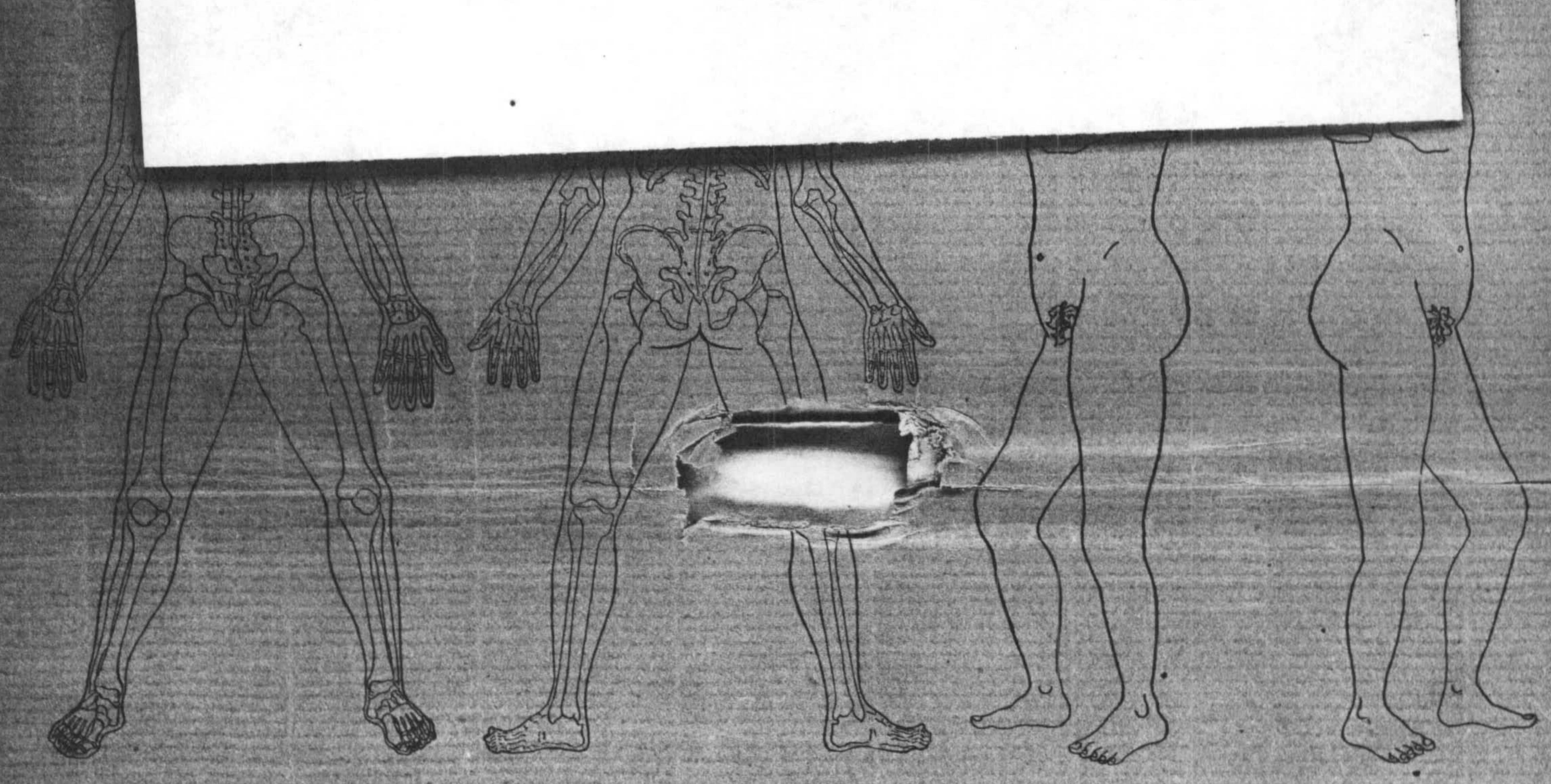
All the digestive organs liver and stomach and bowels are in a comparatively healthy condition - the kidneys, rectum bladder and all splanchnic perform their functions well

for a man of his age - there is no disease of kidneys nor of bladder nor of rectum.

There is hemiplegia the of loss of sensation extends along the whole right side - the motor disturbance also extends along right side - no epilepsy - slight obscurity the right ear is slightly deaf but with it he can hear ordinary conversation 10 ft - the left ear not affected - the right eye has been dislocated above - the mental condition is fair that is he slowly and in a stammering manner answers questions - there is no insanity. The description of right arm under "rheumatism" already contains a partial description of the results of paralysis - pinching the right arm or right leg does not at present furnish him - his muscles and hands do not show evidence of labor - Wife was compelled to lift him up from chair while he took a cane in left hand to assist him and he went out.
