Occupation, cooking, washing and ironing. Residence, 32 E. Preston Street, Baltimore, Md. My maiden name was Folk. My married name is Sanders. I have known Harriet Wesley some 23 or 24 years. I got acquainted with her in Fittlesbury below Cambridge on the Eastern Shore. Her maiden name was Brummer. I had known her about ten or eleven years as near as I can come at it when she married John Wesley. I did not see her married but I know the rights of her marriage. I guess she was about 40 when she married. She was an old maid. She had never had any husband till she had him. She had never lived with any man as wife. She was not out of that sort of stock. I barely knew John Wesley having met him through her a few months before their marriage. I had heard people say that he had had another wife and that she was living here in Baltimore at the time he married Harriet. I have heard him say that he was not married to the other woman (Caroline) that he had only taken up with her in slavery times. John Wesley and Harriet were married here in Baltimore. They lived together always till he died last year some time. I attended his funeral that is a started was too late. I had seen his dead body the Sunday night before he was buried on Tuesday. She has not had any other husband since that, nor has she lived with any man. I see her about once a month. I used to make her house my home for the last 3 or 4 years till lately I stopped it. She has no property except some old lumber of furniture. She worked very hard for a living, washing, scrubbing or anything else that she can get to do. She has three children now under 16. The oldest, Lily, is about 17. The others are Sarah Catherine, Saml (William Henry) and Martha. I don't know any of their age. They are still living. I saw Sarah Catherine Saturday. This statement has been read to me and it is correct.
