DEPOSITION *F*Case of *Chas. J. Brooks*, No. *1173127*

On this *7* day of *Sept*, 1899, at  
*Centerville*, county of *Dusser Anne*  
 State of *Md.*, before me, *N. M. Hill*, a  
 special examiner of the Bureau of Pensions, personally appeared

*Charles E. Frazier*, who, being by me first duly sworn to  
 answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this special  
 examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says:

I am about 78 years of age; my post-office address is *as above*.  
 I enlisted here in *Centerville* in *Co. A 19 U.S.C*  
*Regt.* in the fall 1863. and I think we went into  
 Camp at *Remick, Md.* Captain *Doak* <sup>(know?)</sup> was my first  
 Captain. I knew a man in the company named  
*George Brooks* - I used to call his name - I was  
 orderly Sgt. I cannot tell what he came of *George*  
*Brooks* - I think he was in *Texas* with us but am not  
 sure. I do not remember any other *Brooks* - yes I do  
 too, I recall there was a *Jim Brooks* in our company  
 and he lives in *Baltimore* now. I saw him  
 in *Baltimore* right after we came home. *Jim*  
*Brooks* is a brown skinned man - a short man.  
 I do not recall that there was any other man named  
*Brook* in the company. No, there was not many  
 men wounded in our company. I do not know that  
 either one of the men named *Brooks* was wounded.  
 I cannot say whether *Jim Brooks* was wounded  
 Yes, we were in the battle at the time the mine  
 was exploded in front of *Petersburg*.  
 I do not remember that there was a man named  
*Charles Brooks* in our company <sup>or Jeff Brooks</sup> I cannot remember  
 whether there was a *David Brooks* in the company.  
 I cannot remember whether there was a  *Garrison*  
*Brooks* in the company. I cannot recall that  
 any one of our company was wounded in the arm  
 or wrist. I was away from the company a good  
 deal in the *Prisoner Corps*. I cannot tell where  
*Jim Brooks* came from at enlistment. We were
