After we left Benning we came here to Patterson - from here to Annapolis - from there we marched to Washington. We laid there two or three days on the road side the other side of Georgetown and then marched south.

It is so long ago I cannot remember where we were when we went - do not recall the names of any towns down at the front where we were.

We went to Texas, ^{landed} at Brazos Island and ^{was at} Brownsville.

Our first Captain was Knorr and the Captain who brought us home was Stewart. Thomas was our first Colonel and Perkins our next. John Sutton was our orderly Sgt.

Q Were any of the men in your company wounded?

A Jeff was wounded in the wrist. I do not remember any other. I was present when he was wounded. It was the first time we went into the breast works in front of Petersburg. The regiment was on picket at that time. He went to the doctor after he was wounded and the doctor bound it up for him. I cannot tell whether he went to any hospital.

I do not know where he came from to Benning when he enlisted. I know positively that this man Jeff Brooks, who is with me today served with me in Co. A. 19 U.S. Regt. I have been correctly reported.
