

SUPPLEMENTAL DECLARATION OF CLAIMANT.

Act of June 27, 1890.

To be considered in connection with application heretofore filed.

State of Maryland, County of Green dunes, SS.

In the matter of Charles A. Dickson, Regt. of 39th Vols.

ON THIS 27th day of January, A. D., 1886, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace, in and for the aforesaid County, duly authorized to administer oaths, Charles A. Dickson, aged about 53 years, a resident of Centerville, Md., whose Post-office address is Centerville, Green dunes County, Md.

who being duly sworn according to law declares that he is the identical person named in the foregoing application, who served at least ninety days in Co. 31st Regt. of 39th Vols., and who is an applicant for pension on account of his wounds and injuries received in the Battle of Antietam, Sept. 17, 1862.

He further declares that in addition to the above named disabilities heretofore alleged, he is unable to earn a support by reason of the foregoing named disease increasing as age advances and in proportion he cannot perform manual labor to the same extent.

AS EVIDENCED BY STATEMENTS ON FILE IN HIS CASE AND FOR WHICH PENSION IS CLAIMED. That all of said disabilities now exist and that he is unable to perform manual labor.

He further declares that none of said disabilities are in any way due to vicious habits and are to the best of his knowledge and belief of a permanent character and that he has not been in either the Military or Naval Service since Nov. 1864.

and that he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension rolls of the United States under the provisions of the Act of June 27, 1890.

He theretofore requests that this Supplemental declaration be accepted as a part of his Original claim and considered in connection therewith.

He hereby appoints Charles A. Dickson, Attorney at Law, to prosecute his claim, and hereby agrees to allow his said Attorney the legal fee of TEN DOLLARS when the claim is allowed.
